Statutory Authority: Idaho Code Title 67-41

The Idaho State Historical Society is a system of cultural and historic resources composed of the Idaho State Museum, Idaho State Archives, State Historic Preservation Office, and Historic Sites Program. The agency was established by statute in 1907 and is organized within the Department of Self-Governing Agencies. The

agency's core functions, as stated by Chapter 41, Title 67, Idaho Code, are that the agency's trustees shall:

1) Identify, preserve, and protect sites, monuments, and points of interest in Idaho of historic merit (Section 67-4114, Idaho Code);

2) Protect archaeological and vertebrate paleontological sites and resources on public land (Section 67-4119,Idaho Code);

3) Govern the agency and administer the powers and duties required to preserve and protect any historical record of the history and culture of Idaho (Section 67-4123, Idaho Code);

4) Encourage and promote interest in the state of Idaho and collect, preserve, and exhibit artifacts/information illustrative of Idaho history, culture, and society (Section 67-4126, Idaho Code);

5) Facilitate the use of records for official reference and historical research (Section 67-4126(6), Idaho Code);

6) Be responsible for records management services for state government and accept archival material from local governments (Section 67-4126(7), Idaho Code);

7) Serve as the Geographic Names Board of the state (Section 67-4126(15), Idaho Code);

8) Carry out the preservation and protection of the state's historic, archeological, architectural, and cultural heritage resources (Chapter 46, Title 67, Idaho Code);

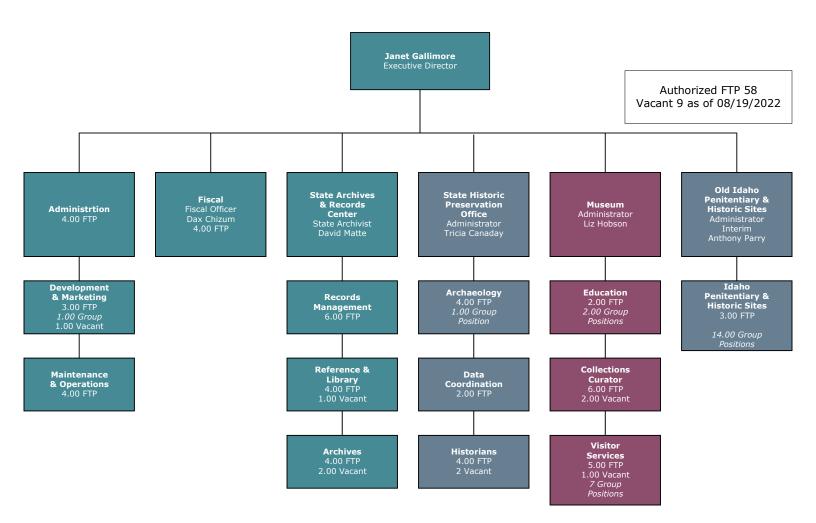
9) Provide for the creation of an Idaho Archeological Survey (Section 33-3901, Idaho Code);

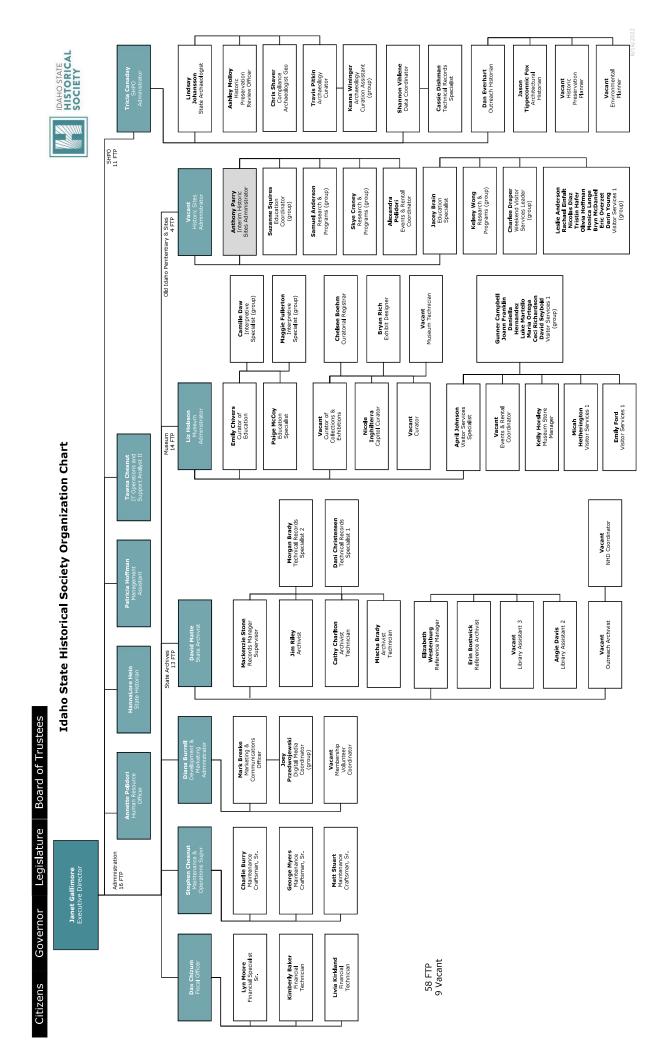
10) Be responsible for consolation, determination of appropriate actions, and providing for reinternment of human remains that have been disturbed (Chapter 5, Title 27, Idaho Code); and

11) Administer the National Historic Preservation Act that assigns responsibility to the state historic preservation officer for administration of the national historic preservation program at the state level (54 U.S.C. 300101).

Explain the request and provide justification for the need.

The Idaho State Historical Society is requesting a supplemental for its 0450 75 Records Management Service Fund for the State Records Center. This supplemental is needed to address a shortfall in appropriation in Capitol Outlay to meet the lease contract needs for the State Records Center.

If a supplemental, what emergency is being addressed?

The State Records Center storage warehouse lease was in negotiation during the FY 2023 budget process and completed after the Idaho State Historical Society appropriation Senate Bill 1371 was approved by the legislature. The finalized lease agreement with the Bennett Kendall Center LLC for 15,460 sq. ft. of warehouse space, home to the State Records Center, resulted in an unanticipated 38% rent increase from the previous year. This has resulted in an appropriation shortfall in the State Records Center Capitol Outlay for FY 2023 currently \$120,400 with a lease obligation for FY 2023 of \$161.400.

Title 67 State Government and State Affairs, Chapter 41 State Historical Society (67-4126) 7. To be responsible for records management services for state government. Records management services include the management, storage and retrieval of all state created records under retention. State created records shall mean any document, book, paper photograph, sound recording or other material, regardless of physical form or characteristic, made or received pursuant to law or in connection with the transaction of official state business. The board may charge reasonable amounts for records management services. The records managed pursuant to this subsection will not be subject to the exemption in public records law provided in section 74-101(15), Idaho Code. Title 67 Chapter 41 (67-4129C) Records Management Services Fund There is hereby created in the state treasury the "records management services. The lease agreement as negotiated is for a three-year period from 07/01/2022 to 06/30/2025 with a 3% increase the second and third year of the lease. The ISHS will seek additional needed appropriation annually through the budgetary contract inflation request to meet this increase.

Market cost was the noted method of calculation in determining the lease agreement.

Provide detail about the revenue assumptions supporting this request.

The State Records Center is a cost recovery model. As per code Moneys in the fund shall consist of funds received from state and local governmental agencies for records management services and the Idaho state historical society shall have the authority to charge and receive payment from such agencies in accordance with rules promulgated or procedures or guidelines established by the agency. These funds are collected through an Idaho State Historical Society board approved fee schedule for goods and services. Working closely with the Records Center Manager that fee schedule is being updated to account for increased cost to manage the program while ensuring those fees do not outpace the private sector supplying the same or similar services. This coupled with a feasibility study on finding a new home for the State Records Center will ensure the long-term ability of the program to maintain its cost recovery model.

Who is being served by this request and what is the impact if not funded?

The citizens of the state through the State Records Centers critical role in support of all state agencies and their need for a cost effective and efficient means of managing and storing the public records of the state.

LEASE AMENDMENT No. Five

THIS LEASE AMENDMENT ("Lease Amendment"), made and entered effective upon the date of last required signature (the "Effective Date"), by and between the Bennett Kendall Center, LLC, 209 E Curling Dr., Boise, Idaho 83702 ("Lessor") and the STATE OF IDAHO, by and through the Idaho State Historical Society, 2205 Old Penitentiary Road, Boise, Idaho 83712-0522 ("Lessee"), is an amendment of the Lease Agreement for Space between the Lessor and the Lessee entered into on February 13, 2009, for space located at 5327 and 5383 Kendall Avenue, Boise, Idaho.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties desire to amend the Lease Agreement for Space;

WHEREAS, the LESSEE is legally authorized to enter in this amendment by power granted by Title 67, Chapter 57 of Idaho Code, with the approval of the Department of Administration; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants of the parties, the Lease Agreement for Space is hereby amended as follows:

1. **SECTION 2. TERM.** Section 2 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

The term of this Lease Amendment shall be Thirty-six (36) months and shall begin on July 1, 2022 and end at midnight on June 30, 2025. The Lessee may, at the expiration of the term of this Lease Amendment and without the necessity of renewing said Lease Amendment, continue in its occupancy of the Premises on a month-to-month basis upon the terms and conditions set forth in this Lease Amendment for a period not to exceed one (1) year. The Lessor may terminate the Lessee's month to month occupancy upon ninety (90) days' prior written notice to the Lessee.

2. SECTION 3. PAYMENT. Section 3 is hereby deleted and replaced with the following:

The first year's lease payment shall be payable in monthly installments of \$13,450.00 each. The total yearly lease payment is \$161,400.00 and shall adjust according to the schedule below in this Section. The lease payment shall be computed at a rate of approximately \$10.44 per square foot, per year. The total square footage of the Premises is 15,460, subject to measurement using BOMA standard. Upon election by the Lessee to pay in advance annually, the Lessor shall allow Lessee a discount of Zero Percent (0%). The lease payments shall be paid pursuant to the Lessor's timely submission of invoices for payment. Upon receipt, Lessee shall forward Lessor's invoice to the State Controller for payment. Lessor specifically acknowledges that State vouchers are processed by the State Controller, not Lessee. Therefore, any payment that is made no later than sixty (60) days after it is actually due shall not be considered an event of default. Lessee shall use its best efforts to expedite payment. It is expressly covenanted and agreed that any prepayment of rent made by the Lessee under the terms of this Lease Agreement shall be considered as an advance payment of rent only and no part thereof shall be considered as a security or cash deposit.

Background:

The Idaho State Historical Society (ISHS) was founded in 1881 by the territorial legislature and established as a state agency by the legislature in 1907. We are an extraordinary system of cultural and historic resources comprised of the Idaho State Museum, Idaho State Archives and State Records Center, State Historic Preservation Office, also known as SHPO, and Historic Sites Program.

Our mission is to preserve and promote Idaho history, which is authorized through 74 state statutory mandates and the National Historic Preservation Act.

21 states, including Idaho, deploy the structural model where the State Historical Society, an executive branch Agency, administers the Core Programs of State Archives and State Records Center, State Museum, State Historic Preservation Office, and State Historic Sites. This consolidated structure advances expertise sharing, leveraging of fiscal and human resources, cross marketing, and comprehensive fundraising, resulting in a highly efficient organization.

The ISHS creates value by stewarding irreplaceable state-owned collections, providing information and understanding about Idaho history, stipulating local voice to federal decision making with regard to Idaho's cultural and archaeological resources, supporting Idaho's educational and curriculum needs through informal and applied learning opportunities, serving as the official repository for the state's permanent government records, and providing records management services to over 30 state agencies.

In partnership with the Foundation for Idaho History the ISHS raises private funds to leverage its annual state appropriation, again benefitting taxpayers of Idaho. ISHS engages donors, sponsors and granting agencies for funding for educational components of its mission, including permanent and special exhibits, field trip scholarships for Idaho schools, student scholarships to attend National History Day competitions, interpretive signage for the ISHS Historic Sites Program, restoration of historic buildings and commemorative events such as Idaho Women 100 celebrating the 100th anniversary of the women's right to vote.

The ISHS is requesting ongoing spending authority in the amount of \$1,000,000 in each of its dedicated and federal funds.

The reason for this request is to provide the Idaho State Historical Society the opportunity to apply for and accept non-state funds raised to create new, experiential exhibitions at its Old Idaho Penitentiary and invest in rehabilitation work for the State Assay Office, one of three National Landmark buildings in Idaho.

Old Pen Reimagining

Building on the significant success of reimagining the Idaho State Museum, the Agency is currently conducting a major planning effort to improve and expand educational access at the Old Idaho Penitentiary Historic Site. The estimated range of expense for design, fabrication, and installation of all new exhibitions at the Old Pen is \$8-\$12 million.

The exhibitions at the Old Idaho Penitentiary represent a mixture of past practice. The Old Idaho Penitentiary Reimagining Project intends to create a comprehensive interpretive strategy and new exhibition/visitor experience program. ISHS received a grant from NEH to support the project, and is working with external consultants and scholars, stakeholders, and staff to complete this work. The next phase will include securing a design-build consultant to create exhibitions based on this interpretive plan. The Old Idaho Penitentiary is an extraordinary tool for understanding what justice has meant in Idaho's past, and a fitting venue for fostering meaningful conversations about what justice means to us today. Visitors will bring their own ideas about crime and punishment in Idaho. At the Old Idaho Penitentiary, they will find a safe place to learn, share, and join the ongoing work of imagining that "more perfect union," a fair and equitable society.

The Idaho State Historical Society anticipates submitting major grant and foundation proposals to support this effort through the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust, in the amount of \$1 million and the National Endowment for the Humanities in the amount of \$500,000.

Assay Office

The historic U.S. Treasury Assay Office is significant for its association with the development and professionalism of mining in the Intermountain West. The building was constructed by the Federal Government in 1870-71, and, until the Twentieth Century, was the most important example of public architecture in Idaho. Early Idahoans, proud of this important government building in their midst, contributed ornamental shrubs and bushes for its landscape. The property has served as a gathering place and urban oasis for 150 years, drawing visitors and local citizens to its shady lawn, seeking relief from the arid desert of southwest Idaho. Recognized for its outstanding historical significance, the property is one of three National Historic Landmark build

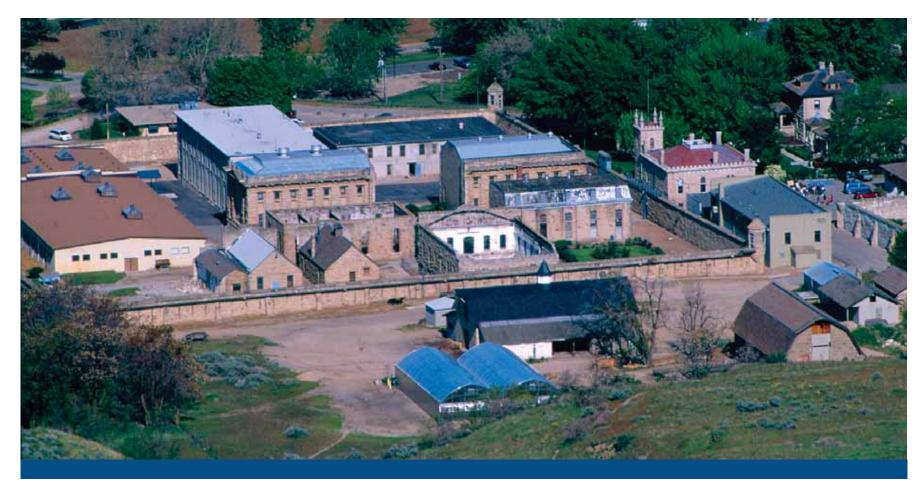
The budget estimates were done in collaboration with DPW for the building. The Assay Office project was the Agency's #1 priority for AR Projects during the FY 2022 budget cycle and was approved at \$500,000. The SAT grant in the amount of \$500,000 was awarded in October of 2021. Start work in the Assay Office Rehabilitation is scheduled for spring of 2023.

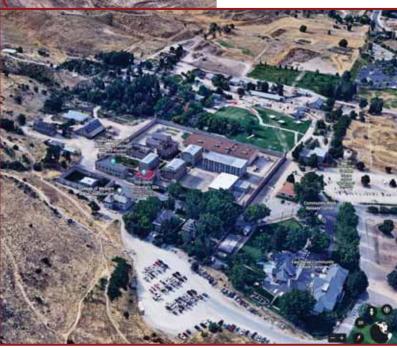


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Letter from ISHS Director

Janet Gallimore, Executive Director & State Preservation Officer

With support from the National Endowment for the Humanities, the Idaho State Historical Society set forth a robust and inclusive planning process to reimagine the visitor experience at the Old Idaho Penitentiary.

In November 2021, the Idaho State Historical Society invited local, regional, and national scholars, community experts, and our professional staff, Board of Trustees, and Foundation for Idaho History to convene in a series of planning sessions to create a formal, interpretive masterplan for the Old Idaho Penitentiary. We thank the Old Idaho Penitentiary Reimagining Advisory Committee for their thoughtful deliberations and participation.

The Old Idaho Penitentiary Interpretive and Experience Masterplan before you is a result of that effort. This guiding document will illuminate our future path as we consider new exhibitions and programs at the Old Idaho Penintentiary. The exhibitions must carefully convey and immerse visitors in the very layered, highly complex, often troubling, and long-tenured history of this place and the people incarcerated here. When we realize our vision for this work, visitors will have a deeper understanding of the history of crime and punishment in Idaho and reflect more purposefully on the meaning of a fair and equitable society.

The stories at the Old Idaho Penitentiary reflect the history of our state, nation, and societal values over time. We aspire to use this moment as we approach 2026, the 250th anniversary of our country's founding, to ensure the preservation of this unique place in our American story, inviting Idahoans to touch the deeply human experience reflected therein.

In October 2021, the Idaho State Historical Society received a grant from the National Endowment for the Humanities to complete an Interpretive Master Plan for the Old Idaho Penitentiary (OIP). The Society has managed the OIP as a historical site since 1973, when it ceased operating as Idaho's principal penitentiary after more than a century of service.

To advise the effort, ISHS Executive Director Janet Gallimore assembled a strong advisory team consisting of museum professionals, educators, judges, law enforcement and corrections professionals, criminal justice attorneys, historians, humanities scholars and community stakeholders.

To learn more about the current and potential OIP audience and their preferences, audience research consultant Gloria Totoricagüena conducted quantitative and qualitative data collection, focus group discussions, and outreach throughout Idaho during the fall and winter of 2021-22. Totoricagüena gathered input from 286 survey respondents that included justice practitioners, law enforcement, educators, Tribal representatives, former inmates and their families, community advocates, corrections officers, and currently incarcerated individuals. Totoricagüena also reviewed survey input from TripAdvisor (979 reviews), Google Reviews (2,249), Yelp (104) and OIP visitor evaluations of multiple public programs from 2017-2022 (668).

In February and March, museum professionals Brent Glass, Senior Advisor to the Sing Sing Prison Museum, and Sean Kelley, Director of Interpretation at Eastern State Penitentiary Historic Site, presented online overviews of the themes and interpretive offerings at their respective sites. ISHS recorded the presentations and made them available to all project participants.



On March 31-April 1, the OIP hosted the advisory committee on site for a two-day Vision Workshop, led by interpretive planner Tim Pfaff. OIP staff toured the team around the penitentiary campus and offered an overview of its history and artifactual collections.

The team spent two days discussing major themes and stories raised by the OIP's century of operation. The team noted that OIP site offered ISHS an important opportunity to invite Idahoans to participate in the ongoing national conversation about mass incarceration and the future of America's criminal justice system. As a Justice Center, the OIP could offer visitors an opportunity to connect the past to the present. The OIP Justice Center would shine light on the subject rather than heat.

The results of the Vision Workshop informed the creation of an Interpretive Vision, an Interpretive Inventory, and Interpretive Strategy for the OIP. Pfaff met with core OIP/ISHS staff bi-weekly to discuss the evolving documents, pursue research questions, and brainstorm opportunities. These documents were then vetted with the full advisory committee for review and comment.

The Interpretive Inventory surveyed the entire site and assigned each OIP destination a level of interpretation based upon visitor accessibility, climate control, and historical sensitivity. The effort was guided by the overriding desire to respect the historical authenticity of the site while offering visitors opportunities to explore its human stories.

The Interpretive Strategy outlined in more detail how particular structures within the OIP campus might offer complementary stories and experiences that together would engage and inform visitors.



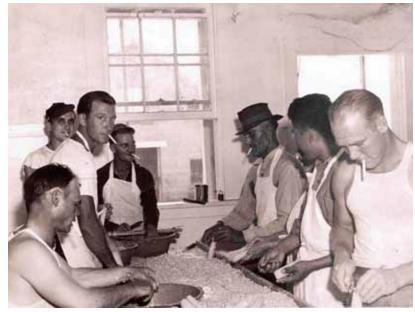

Meeting twice more with the full advisory committee, the OIP core team worked throughout the summer to refine the interpretive plan. At the suggestion of the advisory team, the OIP also worked with the Chief of Prisons Chad Page and the Idaho Department of Corrections to include former and currently incarcerated individuals in the planning process.

This plan reflects the result of this collective year-long effort. As a planning tool, it is meant to inform the multi-year design-build effort that will begin in the fall 2022.

IDAHO STATE HISTORICAL SOCIETY ANNOUNCES "SAVE AMERICA'S TREASURES" GRANT

BOISE, ID – The Idaho State Historical Society (ISHS) has been awarded \$500,000 from the National Park Service (NPS) in the Save America's Treasures program. The NPS, in partnership with the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the Institute for Museum and Library Services, announced \$15.5 million in Save America's Treasures grants to help fund 49 projects in 29 states. The Save America's Treasures program seeks to preserve and rehabilitate some of the most significant and iconic American structures and collections.

After 50 years of use by the Idaho State Historic Preservation Office, and 150 years of service to the people of Idaho, the Assay Office building requires an additional investment to meet ongoing and future needs. ISHS is excited to announce a major rehabilitation of the building funded in part by this \$500,000 Save America's Treasures grant from NPS. This half-million-dollar grant is the program's maximum possible award and the recipient must match the amount dollar-for-dollar. When fully funded, this project will address long-term electrical and mechanical needs, remediate moister infiltration in the basement, and repair and replace deteriorating finishes and fixtures – all while adhering to the highest professional standards for historic preservation. A smaller, separately funded project to rehabilitate and enhance the historic grounds and landscaping around the building will commence with a fundraiser – Wine, Eats, and Artifacts – on October 14, 2021.

From 1999 to 2019, Save America's Treasures has provided over \$339 million to over 1,300 projects to provide preservation and conservation work on nationally significant collections, artifacts, structures, and sites. These grants have leveraged more than \$479 million in private and public investment and contributed more than 16,000 jobs to local and state economies. The combined awards of \$15.5 million will leverage more than \$20 million in private and public investment.

The ISHS request is for funding for equity adjustments for targeted positions with turnover in excess of 50% (8 classifications), mission critical to the agency (5 classifications) and difficult to fill (4 classifications).

Over the past 3-5 years, the ISHS has experienced failed recruitments, turnover, and difficulty in filling unique positions to our agency that require specific credentials as well as those that have significant market competition. For example, we have experienced turnover and difficulties recruiting and retaining specialized positions, unique to our agency such as Curator of Collections and Exhibitions; critical positions, such as Development and Marketing Administrator; and hard to fill positions, such as Maintenance and Operations Supervisor.

We have fully documented the reasons for turnover, and they are primarily associated with lack of competitive salaries. We have worked closely with the Division of Human Resources to remedy this problem through Agency resources and annual CEC process. Our efforts have made some strides in addressing our compensation challenge, but not enough to reduce the significant negative impact we continue to experience fulfilling our mission and operations.

Turnover is detrimental to moral, as it appears that an organization is failing if it is unable to retain talent. Turnover is a threat to organizational sustainability and public trust when critical positions are vacant and essential services cannot be realized I a timely and efficient manner.

Idaho Code 67-4114 gives authority to the agency to carry out the preservation and protection of the state's historic, archaeological, architectural, and cultural heritage resources.

Idaho Code 33-3902 provides for the creation of an Idaho Archaeological Survey and designates the State Archaeologist as director.

Idaho Code 27-501 assigns responsibilities to the agency for consultation, determination of appropriate actions, and provision for re-interment of human remains that have been disturbed.

National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, assigns responsibility to the state historic preservation officer for administration of the National Historic Preservation Program at the state level.
