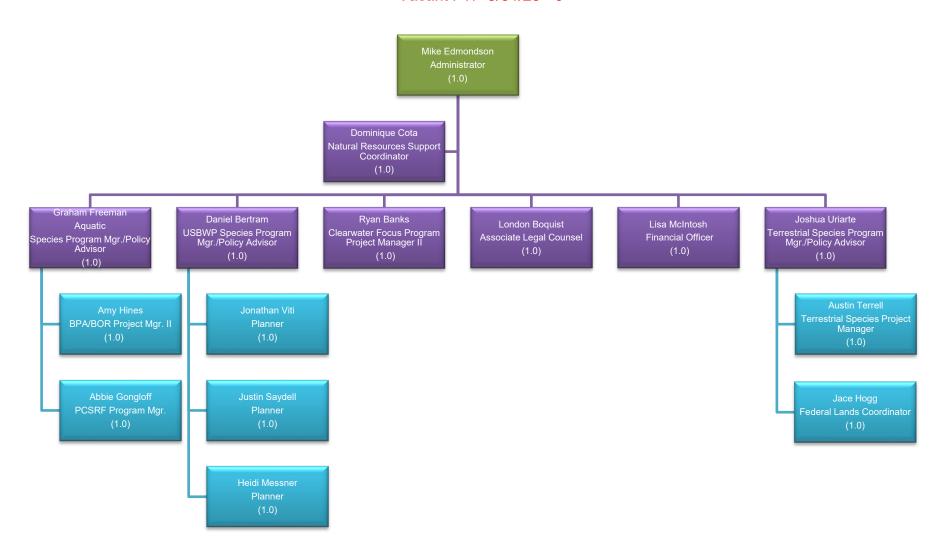

Explain the request and provide justification for the need.

OSC is requesting an additional FTP for the fiscal department to fill the internal control gaps, additional workloads in the various Luma modules and directly support the Financial Officer.

The 2018 legislature appropriated funding for an additional FTP – Financial Officer (FO), to take over the management of the fiscal and HR duties from DFM (Division of Financial Management) who had, since OSC's inception, managed them. Prior to this, the OSC staff process used was to work independently using DFM for help in budgeting, financial reporting, grants entry and all things fiscal.

The Financial Officer (FO) manages and monitors all financial processes as well as payroll-related HR areas. The agency's Administrative Assistant 2 is available to the FO unofficially, a quarter of the time for invoice entry and travel-related processes; however, the position is a support position for all 15 FTP. The FO does not have direct FTE support.

Justification:

- Increased Workload: steady increases since the inception of the Financial Officer position included several audits resulting in establishing grant and deposit internal control approval processes, increase in number of federal grants, and increase in grant oversight i.e., Good Neighbor Authority. In Luma, additional work requirement roles require an increase in internal controls from staff with an accounting background.
- Enhanced Efficiency: this FTE proposal request aligns with the State's goal of promoting responsible government and customer focus as well as OSC's mission and vision in supporting the agency and its staff to do their work effectively, without administrative time delays in service to stakeholders and the citizens of Idaho. Several of the goals and objectives in OSC's strategic plan rely on the efficiency and accountability of the fiscal department.
- Specialized Skills or Expertise: if this FTP request was granted, the agency would look for candidates with accounting training/education experience to support the agency's fiscal department. Currently the OSC fiscal department of 1 does not have the flexibility to allow for adequate vacation/sick leave coverage, leaving OSC vulnerable in meeting the State and agency goals and objectives. This FTP would reduce the agency's overall liability, i.e., vacation/sick leave coverage which reduces leave liability costs, employee burnout and turnover.

The agency has been fully staffed since January 31, 2023. There are no additional vacant FTPs and no additional funding options in the group or temporary arena.

If a supplemental, what emergency is being addressed?

NA This request is not a supplemental request.

Specify the authority in statute or rule that supports this request.

The Governor's Office of Species Conservation was established through Senate Bill 1490 (67-818, Idaho Code). In this code the Office is designated to provide the citizens of Idaho with an ombudsman to address their issues and concerns related to ESA listed species. The fiscal office acts as a foundational support for the agency for federal grants, subcontractor payments, internal control processes, audits, etc., to continue to effectively support staff and Idaho citizens. If the fiscal office is overloaded or delayed, OSC will have difficulty meeting the State of Idaho's core principles; Professionalism, Promoting Responsible Government, Customer Focus and Leadership.

Indicate existing base of PC, OE, and/or CO by source for this request.

OSC currently has no vacancies. All 15 FTP are filled and therefore, no adequate salary savings are available to accommodate this request. The new FTP request would be a general fund position; however, OSC uses cost accounting to allocate time worked on federal funds.

The existing ongoing personnel (PC) general fund appropriation base for FY 2024 is: \$837,600 with a projected salary savings of \$6,139.

The existing ongoing operating (OE) general fund appropriation base for FY 2024 is: \$893,000 – of this amount \$675,000 is Sage Grouse, \$75,000 is one-time (OT) U of I Sage Grouse funding, \$15,000 is Roadless and the balance of \$128,000 provides the remainder of operating expenses.

What resources are necessary to implement this request?

Any additional resources, such as computers, software, furniture, etc. would be provided from existing operating appropriation.

List positions, pay grades, full/part-time status, benefits, terms of service.

The position requested would be a full-time (40 hrs/week) FTP Financial Specialist, SR paygrade "L". For the salary range minimum of \$25.02 to policy of \$33.37 we would be requesting 80% of policy which is \$26.70 x 2080 = \$55,536 + \$26,847.30 Benefits (rates obtained from the FY25 Budget Development Manual) = \$82,383.30

Will staff be re-directed? If so, describe impact and show changes on org chart.

No staff will be redirected.

Detail any current one-time or ongoing OE or CO and any other future costs.

There would be no one-time or ongoing operating or capital outlay for this position. Any future costs, such as furniture or computer needs can be supplied through existing OE.

Describe method of calculation (RFI, market cost, etc.) and contingencies.

OSC reviewed the fiscal staffing for 3 similar-sized agencies, Office of Energy and Mineral Resources, STEM Action Center and Correctional Industries. The classification for 3 financial positions were pulled from those agency examples: Specialist, Specialist SR, and Technician. These were cross-referenced from the DHR classification tables. The Specialist SR was in line with the OSC's needs.

For the salary range of a minimum of \$25.02 to policy of \$33.37 we would be requesting 80% of policy which is \$26.70 x 2080 = \$55,536 + \$26,847.30 Benefits (rates obtained from the FY25 Budget Development Manual) = \$82,383.30

Provide detail about the revenue assumptions supporting this request.

Best practices dictate fiscal coverage for cross-training, internal controls (segregation of duties), and vacation/sick coverage (reducing leave liability). The Financial Officer is currently covering all fiscal positions with limited assistance from the agency AA2 to enter AP invoices and cash receipts, aid in inventory and travel. The revenue assumption to consider, is that without proper support, loss of personnel result in retraining time and costs and limit effective delivery of services to Idaho Stakeholders.

Who is being served by this request and what is the impact if not funded?

This fiscal FTP request would support the agency in its best practice of providing continuity of operations in service to agency staff who directly interface with the citizens of the state, industry groups, conservation organizations, and local, state and federal agency partners. If the position is not funded, the agency's ability to cross-train with qualified staff, consider succession planning, allow for adequate leave liability management and sustain the support for all stakeholders

Explain the request and provide justification for the need.

Descriptive

OSC is requesting an increase of \$5,000 in spending authority to OSC's current Miscellaneous Revenue Fund (0349-00) along with an additional narrative to improve the flexibility of this fund. This increase in spending authority and expansion of the different species the fund can support would help OSC accommodate outside funding from grants that we may receive to help staff put on the ground to help Idaho's citizens with other ESA issues, besides Slickspot peppergrass such as Grizzly Bear Conflict Prevention.

For Fiscal Year 2010 the legislature authorized a line item for a Miscellaneous Revenue Fund to give OSC the ability to use funding that comes from private and agricultural interests supporting the use of Slickspot Peppergrass conservation agreements. This Miscellaneous Revenue fund is established but the flexibility of the fund is lacking due to the narrow focus in the Fund's budget description, which outlines the fund is for revenue that is related to Slickspot Peppergrass.

OSC has 15 FTP and statewide responsibility to fulfill our mission. One of those FTPs is based in northern Idaho based out of the NRCS office in Sandpoint. This position's main focus is Grizzly Bear Conflict Prevention including Education Outreach to citizens and stakeholders.

- Increased Need from local Communities: The northern Idaho position works with several partners to find funding to increase the measures stakeholders have that will reduce potential conflicts. Recently OSC and IDFG applied for a grant to help fund some of these measures since currently there is not a state funding source that can help out. They were awarded the grant to purchase a dump trailer that would haul dead livestock to the landfill instead of having them out on a landowner's property attracting predators. When the funding was awarded, we were not able to accept the funds because we did not have a line item that allowed this, and the Miscellaneous Fund was not appropriate due to its narrow scope. The employee was able to find an alternate solution to funding the trailer and work with the funders to have them pay the contractor directly for this project, but this increased the employee's workload due to additional facilitation and agreements as well as burdened the funders and the suppliers.
- Enhanced Efficiency: this increases in spending authority and the flexibility to help additional species through the Miscellaneous Fund request aligns with the State's goal of promoting responsible government and customer focus as well as OSC's mission and vision in supporting the agency and its staff to do their work effectively, without additional bureaucratic hoops, administrative time delays in service to stakeholders and the citizens of Idaho. Several of the goals and objectives in OSC's strategic plan rely on the efficiency and accountability when working with Idaho's citizens.

If a supplemental, what emergency is being addressed?

NA This request is not a supplemental request.

Specify the authority in statute or rule that supports this request.

The Governor's Office of Species Conservation was established through Senate Bill 1490 (67-818, Idaho Code). In this code the Office is designated to provide the citizens of Idaho with an ombudsman to address their issues and concerns related to ESA listed species. OSC needs the flexibility to acquire outside funding for not only Slickspot Peppergrass, but all ESA related species to continue to effectively support Idaho citizens in ESA matters. If the employees that are out in the field are not able to acquire additional revenue through private and agricultural interests for all the species under the agency's purview, OSC will have difficulty meeting the State of Idaho's core principles; Professionalism, Promoting Responsible Government, Customer Focus and Leadership.

Indicate existing base of PC, OE, and/or CO by source for this request.

OSC has the potential to receive additional, non-federal grants or donations. OSC currently has \$55,627 in our dedicated fund and from that a \$15,000 in OE spending authority for "Miscellaneous Fund receipts reflect donations from private and agricultural interests supporting conservation

agreements." specifically Slickspot Peppergrass.

What resources are necessary to implement this request?

There are no additional resources necessary to implement this request. Staff would apply for funding or acquire funding from outside sources and work with the current agreement and fiscal staff to utilize the funding.

List positions, pay grades, full/part-time status, benefits, terms of service.

This increase in appropriation to the existing Miscellaneous Fund is not a position.

No staff will be redirected.

Part I – Agency Profile

Agency Overview

The Governor's Office of Species Conservation (OSC) was created in 2000 with passage of Senate Bill 1490, which established the agency within the Executive Office of the Governor. OSC is dedicated to planning, coordinating and implementing the State's actions to preserve, protect and restore species listed as candidate, threatened and endangered under the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA). This work is done in coordination with the State's natural resource agencies and with input from the citizens of Idaho, while taking into consideration the economic vitality of the State. OSC is located on the first floor of the Borah building across the street from the Idaho State Capitol. The office also has two satellite offices in Salmon, ID and Moscow, ID.

Core Functions/Idaho Code

- 1) Coordinate federal ESA programs with State agencies (§ 67-818).
- 2) Solicit, provide, and delegate funding for ESA programs (§67-819).
- 3) Create de-listing advisory teams (§ 36-2402, 2403, 2404).
- 4) **Serve** as the State's "one voice" on ESA policy (§ 67-818, 2(a)).
- 5) **Provide** a mechanism for Idaho citizens to voice ESA concerns (§ 67-818, 2(g)).
- 6) Facilitate collaboration between State, federal and private stakeholders (§ 67-818, 2(b)(c)(g).

The Office of Species Conservation maintains three goals that guide the performance of its core functions:

- 1) Coordinate implementation of State policy among State agencies with regards to ESA programs.
- 2) Negotiate agreements with federal resource agencies that rely upon science and common sense, involve all parties affected by recovery decisions, and incorporate Idaho's economic vitality and values into planning and decision-making processes.
- 3) Coordinate the solicitation of funding resources and provide reasonable oversight and insure cost effective allocation of funding for ESA programs.

Challenges to fulfilling the Office's mission include changes in federal regulations, adjustments in priorities due to petitions and/or litigation, unpredictable funding, and random environmental events that impact ESA species.

Part II - Performance Measures

OSC collaborates with State natural resource agencies and stakeholders to coordinate the State's actions on all ESA recovery plans, management plans, public comment periods, biological opinions, species specific recovery projects, and assistance programs.

Goal #2: Negotiate agreements with federal natural resource agencies that rely upon science and common sense, involve all parties affected by ESA decisions, and incorporate Idaho's economic vitality and values into the decision-making processes. OSC facilitates and/or participates in the development of species and/or habitat conservation programs with Idaho citizens and industries that may be affected by ESA species listing decisions and critical habitat designations.

Goal #3: Solicit funding resources and allocate funds to further OSC's mission with an emphasis on transparency and accountability. OSC solicits, provides and delegates funding towards efforts that: a) assist in precluding the need to list species through conservation efforts; b) recover listed species through conservation efforts; and c) balance species conservation with maintain working landscapes and the economic vitality of the state.

Goal #4: Unsurpassed constituent services for State, federal and private stakeholders seeking assistance with ESA issues. OSC serves as an ombudsman for the State on ESA related issues. As such, OSC strives to improve and maintain efficient operation so that the ombudsman role may be exercised to its full potential.
